Dear Miss Stafford,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 20th. I am sorry that the receipt of the cheque of frs.243 has been lost and I am sending you enclosed Mr. Watterson's letter which I signed acknowledging the receipt of this sum.

On your informing me that this cheque included 150 gold mark I drafted a rough calculation of the amount which I expected to be due to me according to the informations given in the form which I filled in at Brussels. The result of this calculation struck me as not agreeing with the sum I actually received. I do not doubt that the error lies on my side; as a science man, however, I am interested to know which point of my calculations is wrong. I may ask you, therefore, to examine the enclosed account and to let me know where the mistake lies. As soon as you inform me that my calculations are wrong and that yours is right I shall send the cheque of 35 gold mark to Mr. Watterson without further delay.

I am afraid that I owe you apologies, first for making the mistake with the goldmarks, and then troubling once more with this other question.
