Dear Professor Schroedinger,

I am most grateful for your helpful and understanding letter, in spite of the disappointing news that you had to cancel your journey to London.

I am so fascinated by your manuscript that I am quite prepared to do all I can in order to put it on the air. At present, the matter rests with my colleague Mr. Troke, (for our European Programme in English) who tries to cut the script in such a way that it will both satisfy you and provide the required length. It certainly is most generous of you to leave this delicate operation to us. Of course, the decision as to whether or not we have been successful must be entirely yours, and we are doing the job at the risk that your verdict may be against us.

Our English Service proposes to transmit the two talks on June 30th and July 7th. Arrangements for the recording will be made at Dublin unless you can be in London before the end of June. Needless to say, I would prefer to have the talks recorded in London, which would give me the pleasure of meeting you here, and I still hope that there will be a meeting of the Royal Society which you might wish to attend.
